

## YEADON WESTFIELD JUNIOR SCHOOL - SPORT PREMIUM FUNDING 2014-15

**Total PE & Sport Funding this Academic Year: £15, 836.29 (£9060 for 2014/15 plus C/F of £6776.29 from 2013/14)**

### Brief Overview of PE & Sport Provision in the school:

At Yeadon Westfield Junior School our PE provision is broad and balanced. Children have access to 2 hours of quality PE per week which follow the National Curriculum and covers the 4 main areas of games, dance, gym and athletics. Our high quality PE curriculum:

- Aims to ensure that all pupils develop the fundamental skills and competence to excel in a wide range of physical activities.
- Develops physical literacy.
- Allows pupils to learn about themselves, the importance of a healthy lifestyle, self-expression, fair play and respect.

As a school we recognise the impact that PE and sport have on a positive school ethos and we acknowledge the positive value of sport in whole school strategies. Major sporting events are celebrated in school and involve all the children participating in linked events and activities. Our staff have knowledge and understanding of the key behaviours of a healthy and active lifestyle and feel confident at delivering PE lessons. Extra-curricular clubs are offered throughout the week that staff deliver free of charge. Being part of the Aireborough & Wharfedale Sports Association and the Leeds North West School Sports Partnership provides us with opportunities to take part in inter-school festivals and city wide competitions.

### School PE & Sport development priorities based on our school context and identified pupil need:

Self-review and evaluation using the YST self-review tool indicated that we were semi-established with our level of provision and the areas that we need to work on to become Established have become our Development priorities for 2014-15:

1. **Professional development for staff to gain confidence in certain curriculum areas, impacting on better quality first teaching for all children.**
2. **To provide further extra-curricular activities to cater for the needs and wants of ALL pupils.**
3. **To increase the range of opportunities for competitions and tournaments both within and between schools.**
4. **To develop the leadership skills of pupils in school.**
5. **To provide more resources to support KS2 learning.**
